
VENOUS & LYMPHATIC MALFORMATIONS



- Congenital abnormal development of veins and lymphatic vessels that can affect any part of the body.
- Usually present within the first few years of life with soft bluish to purplish swellings, and occasionally skin blebs that may discharge clear lymphatic fluid.
- Complications such as recurrent bleeding, chronic pain, infections, limb length discrepancies and scoliosis are more common in the rarer subgroup of syndromic vascular malformations.
- Examples include Klippel- Trenaunay Syndrome, Sturge-Weber Syndrome and CLOVES Syndrome.
- Management aims to enable affected children to be able to perform their normal daily activities.
- Requires one of, or a combination of treatment options including sclerotherapy, lasers, surgery, and oral medications, by a multidisciplinary team.
