


APPENDICITIS

Patient Resource Sheet



What is it?

Appendicitis is an infection of the appendix (a part attached to the intestine). The appendix becomes red and swollen, and sometimes it may even burst. This is considered an emergency as it can make you really sick.





What can the doctor do to help me?

The doctor can remove the appendix during a surgery called appendectomy.

How long is the operation? 30 min - 1 hourHow long is the hospital stay? Usually 2 - 3 days (7-10 days with a burst appendix)

What should I do to get better?

- 1. **Start moving:** To work together with the physiotherapist to start sitting up and walking around 1-2 days after the operation.
- 2. <u>Take your medicine</u>: Make sure to take the medicines given by the nurses as it can help to control your pain and prevent further infection.
